From The Pastor's Desk

"BECOMING KINDER"

Where has our summer gone? It seems like only yesterday that we were celebrating the last day of school! Well with school looming just around the corner, as well as a multitude of visitors coming to our city for the eclipse, I wanted to share with you about becoming kinder people. I just recently addressed the word, kindness, in my last portion offering, and after an occurrence took place while we were in Texas, I thought I would talk just a little more about it.

For those of you who didn't know, I was part of a group of 15 who attended Student Life Camp in Arlington, Texas. Our group was part of a group of about 1200 who attended the camp. As part of our daily schedule, we had a morning celebration/worship time, and an evening worship time.

Now as you may not know, each group's aim is to get to the place of worship early enough so that they can save seats for their group as close to the front as they can get them. This differs greatly from what you see in your average churches on a Sunday morning. Now sometimes you have groups that are willing to work with you on which rows you both need...and sometimes you don't.

On the last night of our stay in Arlington, we had two of our leaders make their way to the worship center to hold seats for our group. They did a remarkable job of making their way to around the fifth row. Suddenly they were confronted by a leader from a large group that had come from Texas. She walked right up to our leaders and proceeded to "remind them," as if they knew, what church they were and that it was "understood" that the front seats were theirs. Now our leaders had two options: 1.Stand their ground and argue. And this is what a lot of us would have done. We would have basically told them "first come first serve" and that they would have had to deal with it...even though the other group had the rows in front of them and needed the seats in our row to complete their numbers. 2. Relinquish the seats and find another row. As leaders, our job is to model for our students, Christ. It's not like there were any bad seats in the room.

We are minutes away from worship beginning, what good does it do to be arguing in front of a group of 1200 people plus staff, the band, and members of the University of Texas at Arlington arena staff?

Rick Warren says that there are two very profound lessons about kindness that we should all know. First, Kindness doesn't happen on your schedule, it happens on **their** schedule. That's why they need kindness. At that moment, you've got to drop everything and stop. Love is often inconvenient, and kindness takes time. Our leaders could have made a big hurrah about our students never getting the opportunity to sit close, and how we have traveled so far away, but they showed kindness...not on their schedule, but when this lady started the incident. God intentionally puts hurting people in our path so that we will learn kindness. The second lesson we learn in becoming kinder is that we must be willing to take risks. Anybody can stand and argue with another person, but the bigger person shows kindness and doesn't allow things to escalate. It's scary walking away. Being labeled a coward, or a softy, or thinking people don't see you as someone who stands up for what they believe...but kindness is knowing what is really important and what is not. Our leaders knew that this was not a battle to fight, especially with a lady that was showing quite an ugly attitude. The onlookers noticed the ugliness of that lady and the Christian "Kindness" attitude of our leaders.

So how will you respond the next time you encounter a situation like that? Will you really lay into that person? Will you blow them off? Or will you seize the moment to show kindness? It's what the world could use a lot more of!


