From The Pastor's Desk

"ALL THINGS WORK FOR GOOD"

Romans 8: 28 says, "And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them." I mentioned in last month's article that we had pledged nearly 93% of our 2019 budget and since that writing it has gone up to 96%. If there is one thing "we know" God has continued to show Himself to us year-in and year-out and we should continue to strive to seek and follow His lead as we grow together as the body of Christ.

In a world where we don't know a lot of things...like what curveball life is going to throw at us the next day, or if the team we are rooting for will win. We don't even know what another individual is thinking at any given time, even if it is someone who is very close to us. The Apostle Paul adds in vs. 26 of Romans 8, "we don't even know what God wants us to pray for." But there are 4 things that Paul wants us to know that we can be sure of from vs. 28:

- 1. *God is at work*. God is always busy behind the scenes. He hasn't checked out or moved on to something, or someone, else. He is ceaseless and tireless. He never stops working.
- 2. *God works for the good.* Not always necessarily for our comfort or entertainment, but God is always working for our ultimate good.
- 3. God works for the good of those who love him. Here is an awesome benefit for loving God! Make his story your story, and your story takes on a happy ending. Guaranteed. God will write a salvation theme into your biography.
- 4. *God works in all things.* The Greek word here is *panta*. *Panta* is defined as "all inclusive." God works, not through a few things, or through just the good things, or through the best things, or even through just the easy things. God works in "all things."

Max Lucado says that our lives are "not like puppets in the hands of fortune or fate. We are in the hands of a living, loving God. We are not a random collection of disconnected short stories. Our lives are a crafted narrative written by a good God, who is working toward your supreme good."

Our God is good, and at work, and only wants the best for us, both as individuals and as His church. 2018 was an incredible year for our church not only financially, but more importantly through the events we were able to host in order to show God's love to His world. I am so looking forward to seeing where God takes us in 2019. God is going to continue to lead people through our doors every week, just like he did last year. Why? Because God is always at work! In the movie, "Chariots of Fire," Eric Liddell, a 1924 Olympian and a devout Christian born to Scottish missionaries in China, sees running as part of his worship of God's glory. In fact when he is questioned by his sister why he continues to run when there is so much work to be done his response is simple. He tells her, "When I'm running I can feel His presence." When we are using the gifts that God has given us for His service, we too can feel God's presence. For me, there is nothing that can make me feel more "fully alive" then feeling God's presence. So let's continue to work for the glory of God and His goodness. I can't wait to look back on this year and see how God has used us in great and glorious ways for His good! For this, is something I KNOW!
