From The Pastor's Desk

"THE BREAD OF LIFE"

In John 6, we find two of the seven signs listed in the Gospel of John. At the beginning of the chapter, Jesus is speaking to 5000 men, plus women and children, when he turns to his disciples and asks them where they can get enough food to feed everyone. Philip responds like any normal person when he replies to Jesus in verse 7, "Even if we worked for months, we wouldn't have enough money to feed them!" But Andrew responds like one who has been watching Jesus carefully, and brings a boy to him who has brought five loaves and two fish. We are told that Jesus has his twelve disciples sit everyone down, and then he takes the five loaves and two fish and gives thanks. He then has his disciples begin to serve all those who have stayed to eat, and they return with twelve baskets leftover after everyone has eaten their fill. The people are overwhelmed when they see this miraculous sign and begin to think that Jesus must be the prophet they have been expecting.

After Jesus and his disciples slip away from the crowd, he sends his disciples on ahead in a boat, across the lake, where he will meet up with them the next day. In the middle of the night, a huge storm arises tossing the disciples to their near death. In the middle of this storm they see Jesus walk out to them, and they call out to him. The Bible then tells us in verse 21, "They were eager to let him in the boat, and immediately they arrived at their destination!"

The next day, people begin searching for Jesus and realize that somehow he has arrived on the opposite shore; even though they had seen his disciples leave without him. Jesus realizes that they want more from him...more bread. The people want to be fed, like their ancestors were in the desert with Moses. Jesus then explains to them that there is spiritual bread that will satisfy them for all eternity. In verse 33 he says, "The true bread of God is the one who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." And then to make his point even more clear he states to them that he is that very bread. In fact in verse 35 Jesus says, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry again. Whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

The church is a table where people come to get fed. We had a wonderful potluck meal, last Sunday, following our Annual Meeting. But it's also where we have an opportunity to dine on the Bread of Life, Jesus. Weekly, at church, we learn about His plan for our lives, have a chance to study His Word, and discover what our role is at the table. But we shouldn't just sit at the table and continually eat. At some point, we must get up from the table.

The nourishment from the food (the Bread of Life) provides us with the fuel we need to serve others! That's what the life God has given you is all about – serving and helping others. Make sure you are practicing a good diet AND exercise routine. Dine on the Bread of Life. Then, push away from the table and serve others samples of what you are experiencing. We have many events that occur throughout the year where you can be given the opportunity to serve "feed" others! They say that the greatest way to exercise your faith is by serving others! Choose, to begin this decade, this year, this month, **THIS DAY**, to begin a whole new life of service for Jesus.
