From The Pastor's Desk

"HAVE FAITH IN GOD!"

I was looking back at last year's newsletter for this time of the year and I was remarking at how God had shown himself to us by helping us drop from \$11,000 in the red to ending up in the black. This year we didn't fall that deep in the red but we are making our way back to the black again and it looks like that it will happen.

The song I mentioned in the article is the same one that is our theme for 2018, "No Longer Slaves." I had talked about fear and all the things that we had faced during 2016...well guess what, those same things occurred again this year. We had horrible shootings take place in Las Vegas and at a church in Texas. We saw the aftermath of what hurricanes can do in Texas and Florida, and we are seeing the devastation left by the wildfires in California, and earlier in Oregon. We have also had to face the threats of a madman in North Korea who is lobbing missiles into the Sea of Japan like they are fireworks. But all of those things are things we can't control. We also can't let them guide us into living in fear. We have a God who came in the form of a baby and he was labeled the "Prince of Peace." We saw his power over creation when he walked on the Sea of Galilee during a horrific storm and calmed another one by just the sound of his voice. We saw his calmness during the times the Pharisees were trying to trick him or his own town wanted to stone him.

One weapon we need to remember we keep in our arsenal is faith. Faith opens the door to miracles. If you study the Bible and history, you find that every time God moves on Earth and does a miracle, it's because somebody believed. In Mark 11: 22-24 Jesus said, "Have faith in God! If you have faith in God and don't doubt, you can tell this mountain to get up and jump into the sea, and it will. Everything you ask for in prayer will be yours, if you only have faith" (CEV). Do you hear that, Faith can move mountains!

Does God still perform miracles today? Of course he does. Every time you stretch your faith, God does miracles — *every single time*. My question for you is this: What's the mountain in your life that needs

to be moved? What's the thing you've already decided will never change?

Do not doubt or underestimate what he wants to do in your life. Why? The Bible tells us in Matthew 13: 58 that when the town of Nazareth failed to believe who Jesus claimed to be, "And so he did only a few miracles there because of their unbelief." If you are telling yourself, "I don't see many miracles in my life," then how would you answer this question: Are you seeing with eyes of fear, or are you seeing with eyes of faith? Faith opens the door to miracles.

Remember that our theme for 2018 is, "Be of Good Courage." Don't let the things that you see, and will continue to see, in our world dictate how you live! Choose instead to increase your faith in God! We are seeing God's hand move in our church day in and day out. We have had 16 people join our church this year! We have had three baby dedications! We had incredible attendance at our Easter Egg hunt, VBS, Miracle Hills Camp and Harvest Party! We had an awesome Christmas Eve service! I have been told that our pledges for the 2018 budget are now at 94%...that's unheard of...but not for those who trust in God! Remember, HAVE FAITH IN GOD!

My family and I would like to wish all of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! Be God's!
