From The Pastor's Desk

"ACCESS"

Romans 5: 1-2 says this, "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have gained <u>access</u> by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God."

Our theme for Student Life Camp this summer is ACCESS. Access is defined as "a means of approaching or entering a place." In our lives we are constantly trying to gain access to something. In our homes, we try to gain access to our Wi-Fi because we have installed our modem passwords into our phones and computers. When we travel to new locations, we often ask the owners of those spots how we can gain access to their internet connection. They then give us some kind of code to enter and we are then granted access. On the other hand, there is nothing more frustrating than when you can't remember your password and you are denied access to an account. I think I must have a hundred account notecards scattered all around in different locations to help me remember passwords to accounts I constantly need access too. But in life, the most important thing that we need to gain access to is God.

God provided a way. We are denied access to God in our beginning because Romans 3: 23 tells us that we "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." The definition of sin is anything we do that separates us from God and His Word. Romans 6: 23 goes on to tell us that the "wages of sin is death." Death, without a relationship to God, is eternal separation from Him. But Romans 5: 8 tells us that God has a solution for this dilemma. "But God demonstrated His great love for us, by sending Christ to die for us, while we were still sinners." John 3: 16 says, "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him will not perish but have everlasting life." God's incredible love for us is so great that no matter what we have done in our past to deny us access to Him, it is

removed when we believe that Jesus died on the cross for us. Belief is the access key. Romans 10: 9 says, "if we confess with our mouth that Jesus is LORD, and believe in our heart that God raised Him from the dead, then we will be saved." Do you know how "then we will be saved" can be defined in today's terms? Take that phrase and replace it with "then you will be granted eternal access to God."

The last part of the scripture found in Romans 5: 1-2 says, "And we boast in the hope of the glory of God." Remember, worldly hope can be taken away or fades with time. The world places its hope in possessions, pleasures, money, looks, popularity, reputation, friends and family, or even job promotions. Each of these will one day be lost. Money runs out, looks deteriorate, people pass away, and we can lose our jobs at any moment. Christian hope is everlasting. Hope =Jesus. Because of what Jesus did on the cross and His resurrection, we can rejoice in knowing that our eternal future with God is guaranteed. Our access to Him is eternal.

If you are not a believer and want to know how you can gain access to God, then I would love to sit down and talk with you about how you can do that. I can lead you to the access key. If you are a believer, then be "boasting" about what God has done for you and sharing His love with all those around you. Be praying for our students and leaders this coming week as we will be with a crowd of about 900 other believers. Be praying that God will open our hearts and minds to His will. Pray that we will grow in our faith, and that we can share that with others.
