From The Pastor's Desk

"SURRENDERING OUR HEARTS TO GOD"

I recently read a devotional from Rick Warren that ties our theme for 2018 "Of Good Courage" to this Lenten season. It begins with a verse found in 1 John 4: 18a which says, "Such love has no fear, because perfect love expels all fear." So that raises the question, "How do we learn to experience God's kind of love that can free us from all fear so that we can be the followers of Christ we are meant to be?" The answer is that we have to surrender our hearts to God. Well how do we do that?

You start by waking up each morning and giving God control of your emotions and feelings. When you give God your emotions and feelings, God begins to fill your life with His love. In the book of Job, Job has three friends who try to come to his aid after he has lost everything. Most of what they tell Job blames him for what has happened to him, but his friend Zophar does give him some good advice in Job 11: 13-18. He says, "If only you would prepare your heart and lift up your hands to him in prayer!¹⁴Get rid of your sins, and leave all iniquity behind you. ¹⁵ Then your face will brighten with innocence. You will be strong and free of fear. ¹⁶ You will forget your misery; it will be like water flowing away.¹⁷ Your life will be brighter than the noonday. Even darkness will be as bright as morning. ¹⁸ Having hope will give you courage. You will be protected and will rest in safety." Zophar lets Job know that if he will follow these three commands, then God will provide him with eight promises. Do you see them in that passage?

The commands are right there at the beginning of the text. Zophar tells him:

- 1. To prepare (or surrender) his heart to God.
- 2. Lift up his hands in prayer.
- 3. Get rid of his sins by confessing them to God.

These are all commands each of us need to follow as we prepare ourselves for Resurrection Sunday (Easter) during this Lenten season. Give each day to God. Pray! Confess our sins to God and ask for forgiveness when we have failed Him. The cool thing about God is that with every command come promises of hope!

- 1. Your face will brighten with innocence (you are unashamed).
- 2. You will be strong (a confidence to face each day).
- 3. You will be free of fear.
- 4. You will forget those things that are troubling you (like water flowing away).
- Your life will become brighter than the noonday sun (Jesus said in Matthew 5: 16, *"let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father."*)
- 6. You will be filled with a hope that gives your courage.
- 7. You will be protected.
- 8. You will rest in safety (you'll be emptied of worry).

Is that awesome or what? Who wouldn't want to be living with these promises from God? To live confident and unashamed each day! To live free of fear and to forget those things that tend to be troubling us! To serve others and live for God in a way that others see Jesus in us and give Him the praise He deserves! To feel safe and secure with the hope and love that comes from knowing Jesus and resting in His promises. All of this happens when we learn to surrender our hearts to God! Are your willing to surrender your heart to Him today?

Be God's!
