From The Pastor's Desk

"WAITING PATIENTLY ON THE LORD"

In a time in David's life when he was running from Saul, he wrote a number of Psalms that helped describe the feelings he had at that time. One of the Psalms has always been a favorite of mine and I use it when I am feeling beaten down or going through a valley. The Psalm is Psalm 27 and it reads like this:

¹ The LORD is my light and my salvation—so why should I be afraid?
The LORD is my fortress, protecting me from danger,

so why should I tremble?

² When evil people come to devour me, when my enemies and foes attack me, they will stumble and fall.

³ Though a mighty army surrounds me, my heart will not be afraid.

Even if I am attacked,

I will remain confident.

⁴ The one thing I ask of the LORD—
the thing I seek most—

is to live in the house of the LORD all the days of my life,

delighting in the LORD's perfections and meditating in his Temple. ⁵ For he will conceal me there when troubles come; he will hide me in his sanctuary.

He will place me out of reach on a high rock.

⁶ Then I will hold my head high
above my enemies who surround me.

At his sanctuary I will offer sacrifices with shouts of joy,

singing and praising the LORD with music.

⁷ Hear me as I pray, O LORD.

Be merciful and answer me!

⁸ My heart has heard you say, "Come and talk with me."

And my heart responds, "LORD, I am coming."

Do not turn your back on me.

Do not reject your servant in anger.

You have always been my helper.

Don't leave me now; don't abandon me,

O God of my salvation!

10 Even if my father and mother abandon me, the LORD will hold me close.

11 Teach me how to live, O LORD.

Lead me along the right path, for my enemies are waiting for me.

12 Do not let me fall into their hands.

For they accuse me of things I've never done; with every breath they threaten me with violence.

13 Yet I am confident I will see the LORD's goodness while I am here in the land of the living.

14 Wait patiently for the LORD.

Be brave and courageous.

Yes, wait patiently for the LORD.

Yes it easy to get down, especially with all we see on TV, hear on the radio, and glean from our time on social network, but the LORD is faithful and will take you through any valleys. I especially like vs. 14 that reads, "Wait patiently for the LORD. Be brave and courageous. Yes, wait patiently for the LORD." I imagine there were times when David wondered if Saul would ever stop coming for him and the LORD taught him to be patient. So we wait! It is not an easy thing to do in this "I WANT IT NOW" society, but it is something we all need to do. Patience is one of the Fruit of the Spirit. And although we may not see a light at the end of the tunnel, if we wait on the LORD, then he will be our "LIGHT" AND "SALVATION" and our fear will subside! So I guess all I can say then is "Wait!"
