From The Pastor's Desk

"WHAT ARE YOU AFRAID OF?"

In this day and age, there is a lot to be afraid of. It seems that random violence in our society can happen anywhere and at any time, as we have seen recently in El Paso, Texas and Dayton, Ohio. God knows that everyone has fears. I love the fact that God's Word capitalizes on that emotion quite a bit. You see, whenever God himself, or an angel of the LORD, appears to someone the first thing they always say is, "Do not be afraid." In fact that phrase is found more than 44 times in the Bible beginning with God telling Abram in Genesis 15: 1b, "Do not be afraid, Abram, for I will protect you, and your reward will be great."

But your real problem isn't that you're afraid, it's how do I handle fear when it comes over me? Jesus tells us in John 8: 32, "And you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." There are a number of different ways that the Bible teaches us to get over our fear, but I'm going to share with you two ideas that Rick Warren suggests in one of his writings.

- 1. Practice the presence of Jesus: You have to begin reminding yourself every single moment of every day that "God is with me." Before you begin every task for every day tell yourself, "God is with me." The more you say it, the more you realize that God is always with you. You begin to realize that you don't have to set aside any time for God because you are spending all your time with God! When you become aware of God's presence in your life, fear will go away. When God is near, you lose your fear. Why? Because God is love and the Bible tells us "Such love has no fear, because perfect love expels all fear." The more you feel loved by God, the less you'll fear.
- 2. <u>Move against the fear:</u> When we play the game, "Going on a Lion Hunt" with the children at Miracle Hills, part of the

hunt is facing your fear, no matter what it may be (tall grass, fast moving rivers, high mountains, or even dark caves). You sing, "Can't go around it, can't go over it, can't go under it, gotta go through it!" You need to face what you fear the most. That's called faith, and we talked about "Faith in the Fire" a couple of weeks ago in church. You need to open the closet door and see for yourself that the bogeyman isn't in there, or even as big as you thought. Our fears are always worse than our realities. The fear of failure is worse than the failure. Failure is no big deal. You just get up and start over. The fear of rejection is worse than the rejection. The fear of embarrassment is worse than embarrassment. Why? Because our fear goes on for hours, days, and sometimes even months and years. Fear is "False Evidence Appearing Real." Fear is a fake!

So remember, we all have things that we fear in our lives. Knowing how to deal with that fear is what separates us from everybody else. These two ideas will not only help you deal with your fear, but give you solutions to share with others, you know, who are dealing with their fears. So don't be afraid! Why? Because you, "KNOW the TRUTH" and the "TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE!"
